BLUEPRINT FOR PARENTS TO BUILD SELF ESTEEM

POSITIVE TRACKING

- Model making genuine positive comments
- Model being positive about yourself
- Give your child positive feedback
- Improve your own self esteem

POSITIVE EXPECTATIONS

- Give them jobs , and expect positive outcomes
- Comment on the part of the job that was done well even if the child has failed.

PERSEVERE

• At first your child will not believe what you are saying about them – persevere

SEPARATE WHAT THEY DO FROM WHAT THEY ARE

• Don't allow your child to make general comments about their achievements/failures e.g. They may say they are terrible at sport, when what they should be saying is they are terrible at running.

ARRANGE OPPORTUNITIES FOR SUCCESS

• Find out about things your child is good at and put them in a situating where they have an opportunity to enjoy the success and show you that they can succeed.

TURN MISTAKES INTO POSITIVE EXPERIENCES

• If your child is having a negative experience, try and turn it into a positive one.

ENCOURAGE RISK TAKING

• It doesn't matter if a risk turns into a failure...let them have a go, and be there for them, waiting to turn a negative experience into a positive one.


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Scholastic Book Fair 2019

Thursday 15th – Tuesday 20th August




This term (week 4 & 5) we have the popular Scholastic Book Fair. This will be held in our school library and will coincide with our Book Week celebrations.



Solve a Graph Puzzle

Coordinate planes? Four quadrants? Ordered pairs? These are terms that make students in the middle grades uneasy. However, with practice, graphing on the coordinate plane can be an enjoyable activity. Year 5 grade students understand positive and negative numbers so graphing on the four quadrants is a way to apply this knowledge to solve a problem. Using ordered pairs to create geometric figures is like solving a puzzle!

By practicing graphing skills, students are increasing their visual thinking and problem solving skills. Here's a fun, geometric puzzle activity that will capture your child's interest and strengthen his number awareness.

What You Need:

- Graph paper
- Pencil
- Ruler

What You Do:

(2,2), (2,4), (3,5), (4,4), (4,2)



- 1. Using graph paper, help your child draw a four quadrant plane. Label the x-axis (the horizontal line) and the y-axis (the vertical line). Label the intersecting of both lines 0. Label each point to the right on the x-axis 1 to 7. Label each point to the left on the x-axis -1 to -7. On the y-axis label the points up with positive numbers, 1-7, and then label the points down with negative numbers, -1 to -7. If using the printable Coordinate Plane worksheet, print out and review the x-axis and y-axis
- 2. Give your child these ordered pairs and ask him to plot them on the coordinate plane:

(0, -2), (1,-3), (2,-2), (2,-4), (1,-5), (-1,-5), (-2,-4), (-2,-2), (-1,-3)

- 3. Remind your child to plot the first number of the ordered pair on the x-axis and the second number of the ordered pair on the y-axis.
- 4. Next, have your child take a ruler and connect the 5 points. Ask him what geometric shape he created (a pentagon).
- 5. Give your child another set of ordered pairs to graph:

(-2,3), (-3,5), (-4,6), (-5,5), (-6,3), (-4,4), (-2,5), (-6,5)

- 6. Have your child connect the 9 points and describe the shape he has created (a tulip)
- 7. Here's a challenging puzzle for your child to solve. Have him plot this set of ordered pairs:

This time it is important to connect the points in the order shown. If each ordered pair is graphed accurately and each point is connected in the given order, he will have created a five-pointed star!

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In Western Australia, children can start their education in Kindergarten, however compulsory schooling starts the following year in Pre-primary. All children of compulsory school age must be enrolled in school and attend every day—this is the law.

You need to apply to enrol your children in school for 2020 if they are:

- Starting Kindergarten—4 years old by 30 June 2020 Starting Pre-Primary, the first year of compulsory school—5 years old by 30 June 2020
- Starting Year 7, the first year on secondary school
- Changing schools

The closing date for all Applications is Friday, 26 July 2019. Please note Applications for Enrolment are not to be confused with Enrolments. All applicants will be contacted shortly after the closing date advising if their application has been successful and invite them to return and complete enrolment forms.


