MEET THE TEACHER EVENING – 20 FEBRUARY 2019

Many thanks to the parents and guardians who attended these valuable sessions last evening. In total 47% of our parents attended. It is hoped that this will lead to parents seeking interviews to find out more about their children. Teachers had a booklet available for attendees to reinforce their message. These booklets are available from the classroom teacher for parents who did not attend.

The practise of keeping in touch with your child's teachers on a regular basis is really important as we have several programs in the school that aim to address your child's special needs. There are also several agencies that we can reach out to for assistance.

Our aim is to ensure that there are no surprises for you when you receive your child's first report at the end of Semester 1.

PARKING AND DROPPING OFF

As our school numbers increase – there are now 478 students enrolled, parking behaviour is now reaching a dangerous level. Several of our children have experienced near misses due to thoughtless practices by parents. The following rules if followed by all of us should ensure that our children are safe:

1. Travel through the car parks at WALKING PACE ONLY - 5 km/h.
2. Ensure that you park in designated bays only , getting out of your car to accompany your child across the car park.
3. Do not call you child to your car, expecting them to dash across the car park to get to you.
4. Do not park on footpaths as several of our children ride their bikes or scooters and will be obliged to ride on the road to avoid you.
5. Ensure that DISABLED CAR PARKS are left free for the purpose they were designed.
6. Walking your child to school is the ideal healthy solution.

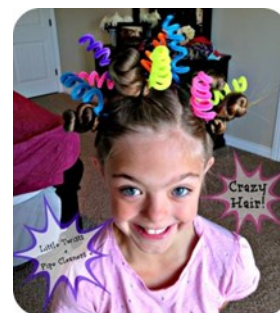

An example of our first session last week;

Warm up – Jog / Lunge and rotate / jog / baby crawl / jog / spiderman lunges / jog / frankensteins

Practice of movements for main workout – skipping / push ups / sit ups / burpees

Main workout 5 minutes to do as many rounds as possible

- 30 single skips
- 5 push ups
- 10 sit ups
- 5 burpees

*once finished burpees repeat from the top

Scaling options

- 15 skips
- Knee push ups
- 5 sit ups
- No jump burpee / no push up burpee.

DECIMAL SHOPPING!

Looking for a way to make maths matter to your upper school child? Here's an activity that will get your child's attention with a shopping spree. The catch? He or she have to use decimal skills to add, subtract, multiply, and divide. This activity can easily be substituted with restaurant take-out menus, grocery coupons, or any kind of catalogue, for year-round maths practice that will add up!

What You Need:

- Your child's favourite clothing catalogues or food menus
- Pencil
- Paper



What You Do:

- Read through the information together with your child. Point out items you know your child will like and build up the excitement about the things that are on sale.
- Tell your child that he or she can shop for their own clothes or food, but only if it stays within a certain budget. Give them the number that represents the limit of his budget, and tell them to get calculating! They need to use addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and pay attention to place value to get the most out of their budget.

Addition

To add up the items that they are considering buying, they should line up all the decimal points in order to correctly compute the total cost. For example: \$29.99 \$45.00 +\$14.99 = \$89.98

Subtraction

To find out how much money is still left in the budget, they will have to subtract what they have already planned to spend from the total budget. As with addition, they should first line up the decimal points before solving the subtraction problem. For example: \$100.00 - \$89.98 = \$10.02

Multiplication

If they do want to get more than one of the same item, they should solve multiplication with decimal problems in the same manner that they normally solve multiplication problems, but must remember to move the decimal point over in his answer as many places as are in the problem. For example: \$14.99 x 3 \$44.97

Division

If you would like your child to chip in for part of the budget, or you are splitting it between parents or others, your child will have to use division. Division with decimals simply requires your child to include a decimal point in their answer directly above the decimal point in the dividend (the number being divided).

Once your child is comfortable working with decimals in these capacities, extend the practice by moving away from the context of money and now having them solve decimal problems that are beyond the hundredths place value. Every cent counts!
