Our school uses the Friendly School program to develop self-esteem and improve relationships in our children. Classroom teachers work tirelessly to develop good relationships and prepare our children for life. A study from the University of Queensland has found that we as a society have a tendency to overpraise our children. This results in our children entering the workforce with a view that they are owed something, a sense of entitlement. They viewed criticism as bullying and as a result were discontented in the workplace. In keeping with these studies, we at Anne Hamersley continue to raise the bar and challenge our children, ensuring that we don't make our children too reliant on praise and always connecting praise with a specific achievement. This is reflected in our Passport Program. So rather than saying to your child "You are a good boy/girl", try praising for specific deeds they may do that elicits praise from you. This will help to develop their appreciation of earned praise and of course their resilience when they are corrected for unacceptable behaviour or behaviours that are not on their Virtues map.

COMMUNITY USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

Samantha Rowe (Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Education and Training), together with Jessica Shaw MLA and two delegates from the Department of Education WA visited our school on Tuesday, 28 July 2020. The visit was part of a consultation process on how schools are utilising the Community Use of Facilities Policy. Discussions were held on our schools' engagement of the policy and the contractual agreements we have in place that benefit the students and our community using our school facilities before, during and after school hours.

We currently have a number of contractual examples that fit within this category such as; The Edmond Rice Sport Program, PMI (Music Tutoring Group), School Canteen, and Camp Australia (After School Care). To assist and share our contractual agreements with the visiting party, open discussions were focussed on the impact the availability of the school facilities have on the community. Further discussions were held on what works well and what could be improved. Our feedback will be considered for further development of policy and to assist with better understanding and implementation of community use of school facilities in the future.



Positive Parenting

Parent Traps

It's tough being a parent but it's easy to fall into one of the common parenting traps.

The criticism trap is when there are frequent power struggles with your child. The situations escalate from criticising to threatening and yelling. This type of discipline often backfires. The parent's anger makes the child and parent resentful and hostile. If these kinds of battles take place frequently, its time to try a new way of handling the situation.

The "leave them alone" trap involves the parent simply not acknowledging their child when they are behaving well. If good behaviour is taken for granted it may be replaced with the misbehaviour that receives more attention. A basic principle of positive parenting is to praise behaviours you would like to see more often.

The "for the sake of the children" trap occurs when parents in unhappy marriages stick doggedly to the same marriage routines, for the sake of the children, rather than addressing the problems constructively.

The perfect parent trap. There is no such thing as a perfect parent and trying to be one will only lead to disappointment, resentment, guilt, and feelings of inadequacy.

The martyr trap is one where parents become so over-involved in the task of parenting they neglect their own needs. The parents' relationship suffers and may end in feelings of dissatisfaction and resentment. Quality parenting can only happen when adults have their own lives in balance.


