DEAR PARENTS AND CARERS

I would like to thank all of the parents and caregivers for your continued support, as we implement operating guidelines to minimise the impact of a potential COVID positive case within our school.

SICK CHILDREN

Parents are reminded not to send their child if they are suffering flu like symptoms. If your child presents to school with flu like symptoms, parents will be contacted to collect their child.

COMMUNICATING A COVID POSITIVE CASE

In the event our school is impacted by a positive case, parents will be informed via email and also receive an SMS. The school will work closely with WA Health as they undergo their contact tracing and determine any close contacts. It is extremely important to contact the front office to update your email address and mobile phone number in order to receive up to date information. Please note, we will not be using Facebook to communicate with parents.

MASKS

Parents and carers, must wear a mask on school sites in regions where a mask mandate is in place, even when outdoors, unless physical distancing can be maintained.

STUDENTS ARRIVING EARLY

Students are reminded if they arrive to school prior to 8:20am they are to enter through the gate between Success and Parmelia. This gate will be open from 8:10am. Students are not to arrive prior to this time and are reminded that there is no waiting outside the other gates around the school.

Parents are reminded to monitor their child's use of mobile devices. Students are participating in cyber safety sessions to remind them of the impacts of social media.

PARENT, VISITORS AND COMMUNITY CODE OF CONDUCT

- Avoid behaviours which are delivered in a manner that threatens, intimidates, or harasses. The use of inappropriate language and behaviour will not be tolerated and will be dealt with accordingly.

Calista 3 has made an awesome start to the new year.

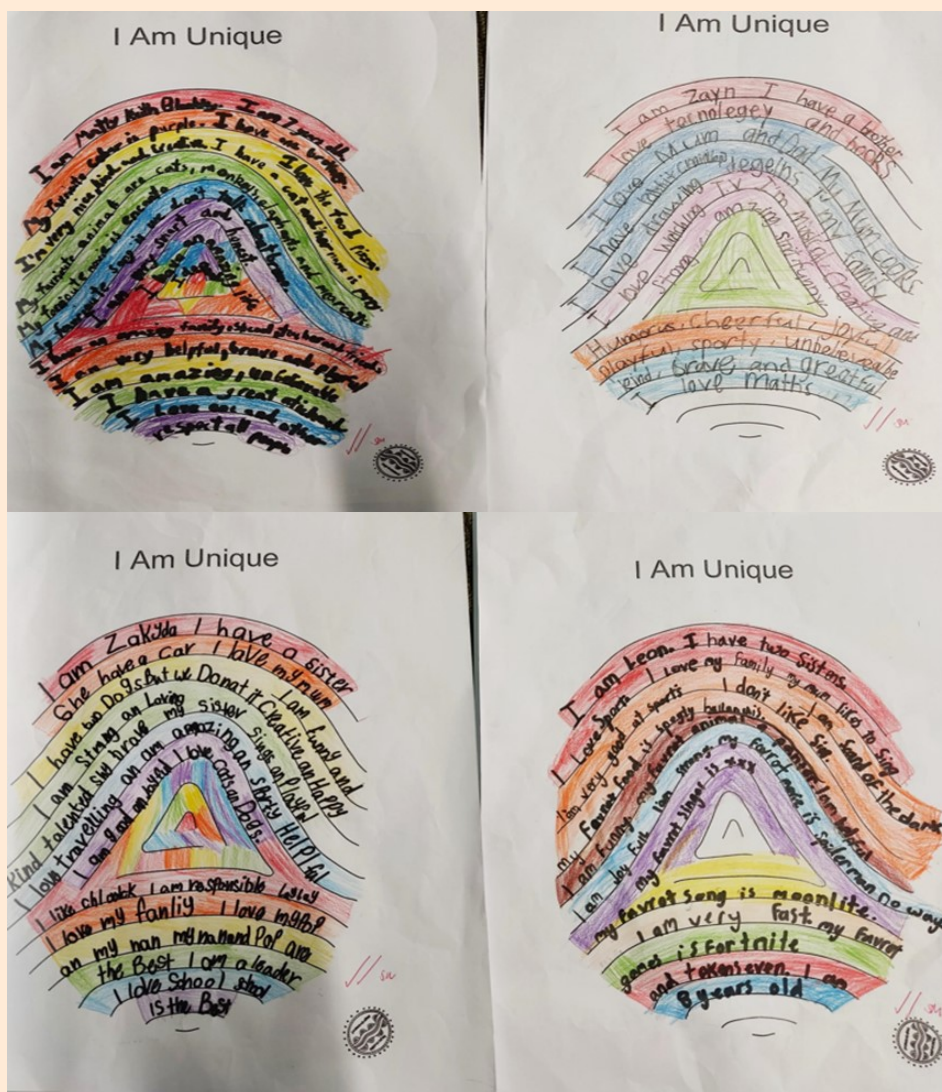
As we were all new to the class, and some of us completely new to the school, we were curious to learn about each other and what makes us unique as individuals.

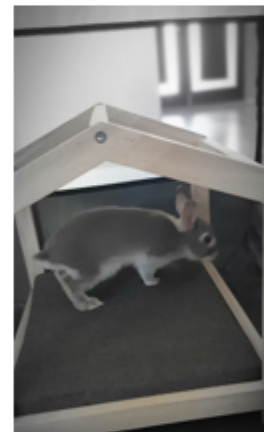

A message from your Coordinator

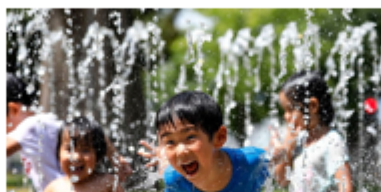
Dear Parents,
